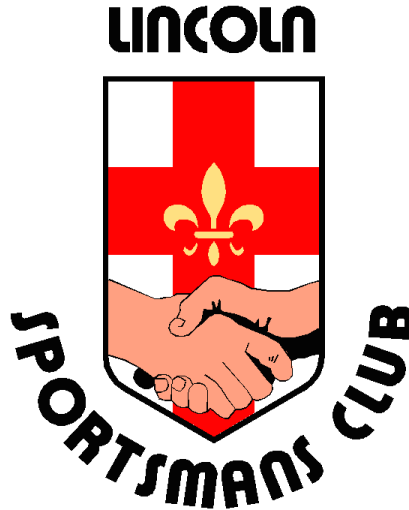

Mike Summerbee is a former English footballer who was born in 1942.

Although originally from Lancashire, he grew up in the West Country. He is most well known for playing for Manchester City during the team's glory years of the 1960s and early 1970s. He played on the right wing and was one of the most influential players of his generation. Known as a bit of a joker he had a great rapport with the fans. He was also a close friend of the legendary George Best, and became one of the cult football heroes of the swinging sixties!



The tenacious right winger (he sometimes played centre forward) signed for Manchester City in 1965 and in his first season was the only player to start every match. This was a very successful time for City (the club winning a number of trophies including the FA Cup and the European Cup Winners Cup), and Buzzer (as he was known to his fellow team-mates) was very popular with the fans. He delighted the crowds with his stylish play and he created many chances for his colleagues. He made over four hundred appearances for the team before transferring to Burnley in 1975.

His time at Turf Moor was followed by a short stint at Blackpool. During the 1978-1979 season he became player/manager at Stockport County, but retired shortly afterwards to concentrate on his various business ventures.

Nicky Summerbee

Hailing from a family of football legends, it is no surprise that Nicky became a professional footballer. His father, Mike; Grandfather, George; and Great Uncle, Gordon, all played professional football and Nicky followed in their footsteps when making his debut for Swindon Town at the age of 18.



Following 112 appearances for Swindon between 1989 and 1994, Summerbee joined Manchester City where he played over 130 games for The Blues.

After his spell at Maine Road, Summerbee moved to Sunderland where he helped the club gain promotion to the Premier League in his first season, where the stats proved he was a better crosser of the ball than David Beckham with an accuracy of 36% compared to Beck's 27%! Summerbee remained at the Stadium of Light until 2001 before going on to play for Bolton, Nottingham Forest, Leicester City and Bradford before retiring in 2006.

Since finishing on the pitch, Nicky has undertaken various media work, including Sky Sports News and presenting Masters Football on Sky Sports 1. Also commentating and interviewing for Talk Sport and Five Live, Nicky is a well recognised and respected former professional.
